35 YEARS OF MILESTONES

In 2018, Resource Center turned 35 years old. That's enough years to have created a rich history while also knowing that we must ensure programs and services are here for many years ahead. Resource Center has seen a lot of changes over those years, both as an agency and in the LGBTQ movement. There was a time when the age of 35 was out of reach to many of the people we served before the drug "cocktail" became available in the mid-1990s, and many people living with HIV and AIDS were struck down in their prime.

Leadership, then and now, has persevered through bias and discrimination to make sure that the LGBTQ and HIV communities are served. In 2018, the Center continued expansion of a PrEP Care Program and Transgender Health Program at historic Nelson-Tebedo. Programs for youth (Youth First), seniors (THRIVE), mental health counseling, transgender individuals (GenderBrave) and women (Women with Pride) continued to grow, positively impacting the lives of everyone we touch. The Center continued its longtime leadership in HIV prevention not only

by offering PrEP but also through its robust FUSE, UBE and Grupo Orgullo Hispano community engagement programs serving young men ages 18-29.

We have also stayed true to our historical roots by providing education and transformative advocacy. The organization was founded in response to discrimination against LGBTQ people. While there is much greater societal understanding of LGBTQ people and issues, physical, emotional and political threats continue. Resource Center expanded its staff devoted to education and advocacy and has built meaningful collaborations and relationships to help advance understanding and equality for those we serve.

We are grateful for your support of Resource Center's mission and programs. I hope you enjoy these stories about the people you reach every day through your investment in our work.

35 YEARS OF HEALTH

"I was living in Dallas when I was diagnosed with HIV in 1989. When I was later diagnosed with histoplasmosis (a type of lung infection) in 2000, the weight of both diseases weighed heavy on me. I couldn't get the care I needed and so eventually I went home to New Orleans. It was only after Hurricane Katrina that I returned to Dallas.

When I came back to DFW not only was I sick, I was homeless and I had lost everything. I was living in a shelter in McKinney when someone connected me with Resource Center, and I'm so glad they did. At first, I just went to the hot meals program to feed myself, but I continued to come back because I knew I wouldn't be judged, and the people there knew what I was going through. It became one of my only outlets for communication. Soon, I moved into an apartment that the Center helped me fill with food, clothing, and toiletries. Then, I could finally manage my disease because they helped me find treatment,

and I had a place to stay. They helped me navigate the complexities that come with living with HIV.

Resource Center was there to share my joy when I stepped on the scale and **FINALLY** had a healthy weight. Every step of the way they were there for me, whether it was assisting me filling out insurance paperwork or giving me a hot meal to ensure my medication works optimally, they were there.

Years later, Resource Center is still here for me. I can still get what I need at the food pantry, and I am a dedicated volunteer and one of their biggest advocates. I am also the chair of the Ryan White Planning Council. Now I can help those who were once in my position because Resource Center taught me to navigate the system and understand the needs and variables of HIV/AIDS. Without the Center, I would be lost."

35 YEARS OF ADVOCACY

Since 1983, Resource Center has worked tirelessly to ensure that Dallas' LGBTQ population feels safe and accepted, no matter where they are. In 2018, the Center partnered with Dallas Independent School District and Toyota to initiate the Out For Safe Schools initiative (OFSS). As a part of the cultural competency program, trained school staff wear badges to publicly identify as supportive LGBTQ allies on campus. Ultimately, OFSS is designed to create a visible adult presence amongst vulnerable students in areas where most incidents of victimization occur.

Mahoganie Gaston, Dallas ISD's homeless education specialist, has been a staunch ally and instrumental in the implementation of OFSS across Dallas ISD schools. Says Gaston, "Having teachers and faculty members as allies and mentors brings that extra layer of support. It sends the message to students they're seen and cared about, and our campuses are accepting and welcoming

environments. The more teacher and faculty allies a student is aware of, the more comfortable they feel being themselves on campus. Students get to see they are not alone, and there is someone who can advocate on their behalf. The greatest result is students feeling safe and supported."

For OFSS, the future seems bright. Gaston will continue to work with the Center in order to implement the program while also strengthening and expanding Gay/Straight Alliances in Dallas ISD. She envisions further partnering with the Center to introduce OFSS training for student allies—starting with informing students on LGBTQ local and state history, and encouraging LGBTQ youth to educate their peers on important topics.

According to Gaston, "The partnership with Resource Center has been very beneficial, and the opportunities for growth are limitless."

35 YEARS OF COMMUNITY

Fifteen year-old Brandon Fontenot serves as president of the Youth Advisory Council at Youth First. As president, he is an ambassador for the program and serves as a leader and role model to his peers. Being an LGBTQ teenager can feel lonely and isolating; Youth First has given Brandon the confidence to advocate for his community by showing him he is valued and an integral part of a larger community.

Says Youth First Program Manager Cami Fields, "I have seen Brandon make tremendous growth in character, integrity and leadership while being a part of the Youth First family. He has created bonds that will last forever and surrounded himself with peers and adults that support and love him unconditionally. Brandon is a dedicated and caring person, and we are so happy to have him at Youth First and on the leadership team! To some, Brandon is young, transgender, bisexual, different. To us, Brandon is one word . . . brave."

Brandon says, "After I came out, I really wanted to meet people with similar viewpoints and experiences,

which is what initially encouraged me to go to Youth First. Most importantly, I wanted to find a place where I felt I belonged. I'm a photographer, and over the past three years Youth First has helped me improve my skills because I have gotten to see the world through other perspectives. I have also learned that beauty comes in many shapes, sizes, colors, genders and sexualities.

I think programs like Youth First are important because they educate queer youth on many different topics. My advice to newcomers is the first night can be pretty overwhelming, but I promise if you keep going you will not only make friends for life-you will be a part of a family forever.

When I think about what Youth First means to me, really the only word that comes to mind is family. Not only do I consider the youth in the program my family now, but Lauren and Cami have become like a second set of parents to me."

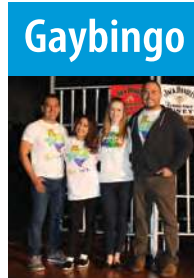

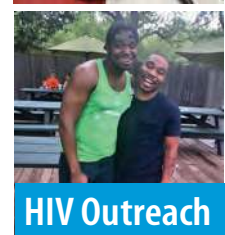

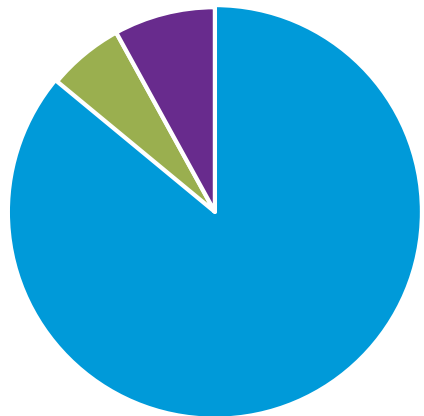

35 YEARS OF GIVING

Havana-born entrepreneur Jorge Baldour is no stranger to giving back to his community. As the founder of After8toEducate (After8), the first all-encompassing program to support unsheltered high school youth in Dallas, Jorge also serves on numerous Dallas boards and committees dedicated to targeting poverty and improving education. Jorge has established himself as major player in Dallas philanthropy. In 2018, Resource Center was grateful to be a recipient when his Oak Cliff-based gallery, Mercado369, donated \$25,000 to Youth First in support of Friday Family Dinners.

In addition to being a Dallas community advocate, Jorge is a steadfast proponent for LGBTQ rights. Says Baldour, "We must understand the potential in our community and also the challenges. The end goal of equality and equity requires all of us to prepare future community leaders by providing them with a support system for their growth and development."

He continues, "Having a positive, inclusive and non-judgemental program like Friday Family Dinner, creates experiences that foster self-esteem and confidence in these future community leaders."

When discussing the future of the Dallas LGBTQ community, Jorge is contemplative: "Dallas is growing incredibly fast both economically and in population. In order for our city to prosper, we need new, prepared, and confident leaders representing all communities, especially LGBTQ leaders that have been cultivated in a compassionate environment."

In the future, Baldour envisions establishing more inclusive practices amongst the young LGBTQ community. "Having culturally sensitive support services, like Resource Center, in addition to same race/ethnicity mental health and medical providers, would foster greater willingness to seek and accept professional services."

35 YEARS OF HISTORY

The year was 1983. “Dallas” was on television, “Return of the Jedi” played at the movie theaters and Michael Jackson’s album “Thriller” dominated the radio. It was also the year that Resource Center got its start. For over 35 years, the Center has provided programs of interest to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer/questioning (LGBTQ) community members and critical assistance to people living with HIV and AIDS and their families. The programs of the Center promote understanding of the LGBTQ community and aim to eradicate the spread of HIV and AIDS.

- **1983** The Center’s parent organization – the Dallas Gay Political Caucus, later known as the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance, established The Foundation for Human Understanding with a focus on education and service, and a goal of achieving recognition and equal rights for the LGBTQ community in North Texas
- **1985** Quickly mobilized to deal with HIV/AIDS epidemic in North Texas and established the AIDS Resource Center as a source of community awareness, prevention education, legal services, emergency funding and basic needs

- 1988 Established the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic for AIDS Research to provide HIV testing, treatment and clinical drug trials. Today, Nelson-Tebedo also offers PrEP access, STI prevention and testing, medical case management, prevention and transgender health services. Through its health and medical services, the Center is a leader in HIV/AIDS education, prevention and services, and provides a full spectrum of STI prevention education, screenings and treatments

35 YEARS OF HISTORY



John Thomas, the first Executive Director of the AIDS Resource Center.



- 1989 Established the first LGBT Community Center in Dallas after a fire damaged most of the Center's facilities. The Nelson-Tebedo Clinic and Food Pantry remained on Cedar Springs Road, while the rest of the organization moved into the former Metropolitan Community Church site on Reagan Street. It was renamed the John Thomas LGBT Community Center after the organization's first executive director.
- 1994 To recognize the history of and the struggle for LGBTQ rights in Dallas, the Phil Johnson Historic Archives and Research Library was established at the Community Center
- 1998 Foundation for Human Understanding becomes Resource Center of Dallas, Inc.

- 2009 Established Gray Pride as the first program for LGBTQ older adults in North Texas

- 2013 Resource Center of Dallas, Inc. starts doing business as Resource Center



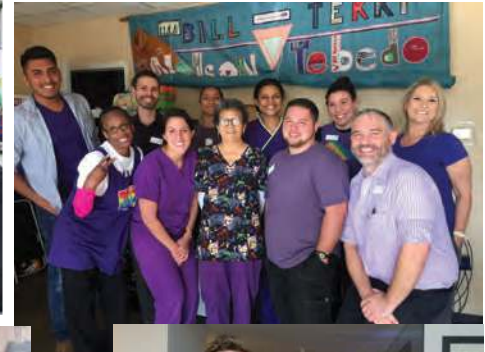

35 YEARS OF HISTORY



- 2016 Opened new 20,000 square foot state-of-the-art Community Center in June. The facility houses Behavioral Health, Grupo Orgllo Hispano (GOH), THRIVE, Women with Pride and Youth First
- 2016 Opened new Harold Simmons Foundation Health Campus in November. Nutritional services are available at the Center's Health Campus on Reagan St., which include a food pantry and hot meals program. Also available at the Health Campus are HIV case management services and insurance assistance services

Today more than 1,200 volunteers and a paid staff of over 71 make Resource Center one of the largest centers of its kind in the United States. More than 61,000 people each year use the Center through its programs and services. From its roots as an advocacy group for civil rights regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity, the Center continues its mission: to develop programs and offer services for the LGBTQ community, as well as individuals and families affected by HIV and AIDS.
